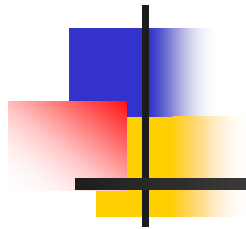

EU External Actions

- Improve effectiveness: acting at the right level
- Improve efficiency: pooling of resources at EU level brings more influence
- Catalytic effects: pooling expertise



Effectiveness: overhaul of current instruments

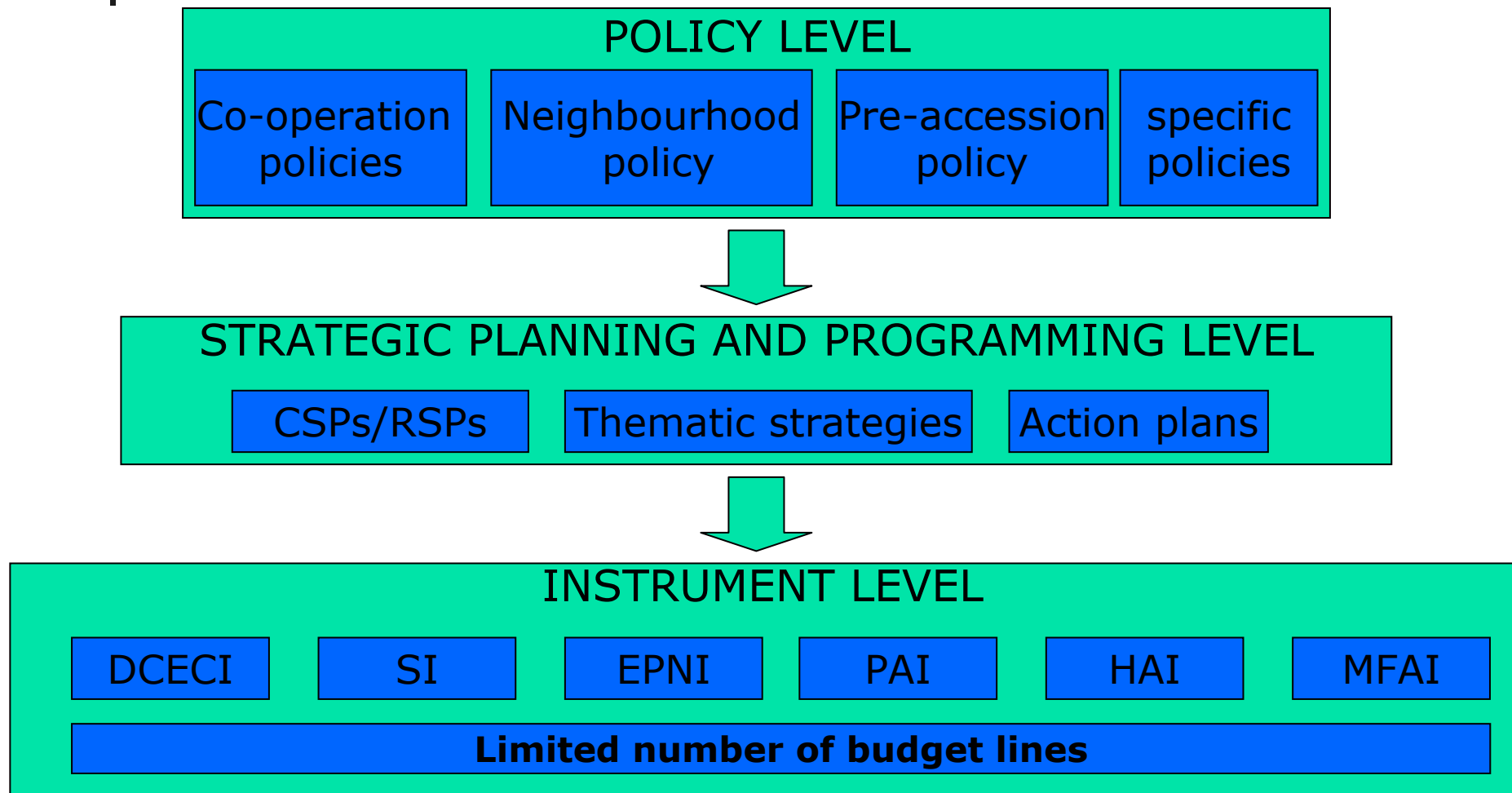
- Plethora of geographical and thematic instruments (35 regulations) in addition to partnership and association agreements
- Excessive number of budget lines (more than 90)
- Parallel application of a multitude of implementation modalities including programming and “comitology” (administrative cost and risk of incoherence)



Principles of simplification

- Policies lead instruments:
 - Simplify structures and procedures
 - Ensure overall policy coherence
 - Output-oriented resource allocation
 - Better dialogue with MS, partners and other donors

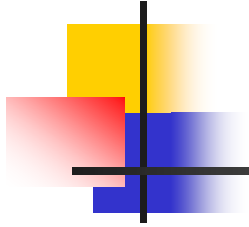

Financial allocations by instrument

- Indicative amounts 2007–2013 (including administrative expenditure):
 - DCECI: 44 229 M€ of which 23 572 for ACP states (includes the EDF as from 2008)
 - ENPI: 14 929 M€
 - PAI: 15 050 M€
 - SI: 4 649 M€
